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## PROFILE 2015-2016

A private college-preparatory all-male boarding school, Marine Military Academy was founded in 1965 by Captain William A. Gary who believed that United States Marine Corps' concepts of leadership and discipline were adaptable to preparatory-school education. The Academy boards grades eight through the post-graduate level. MMA boasts students from all over the United States and over a dozen different countries — as close to home as Mexico and as far away as China. We balance discipline and structure **with strong academic instruction** to shape a purposeful, responsible young man who is prepared for the challenges of life.

**Admission:** The Academy seeks students of good character and serious purpose. A student is accepted on the basis of his transcript and recommendations from his school principal, counselor, English and math teachers. A student's ability to participate fully in the physical activities program is required.

**Student Leadership:** The Cadet Corps is commanded by a *Cadet* Lieutenant Colonel and is organized into five companies. The companies are led by Cadet Officers and non-commissioned officers. **Cadet leaders are carefully selected on the basis of their maturity and leadership abilities.** All Cadets are members of the Marine Corps JROTC.

**Graduation Requirements:** The standard diploma requires 26 academic credits for graduation and must include: English 4 ½ credits; Mathematics 4 credits; Science 4 credits; Social Studies 3 ½ credits; Foreign Language 2 credits; Computer Science 1 credit; Health ½ credit; Speech ½ credit; 2 ½ credits of electives, 4 credits of MCJROTC.

*Placement in Honors, Advanced Placement is by recommendation only. Study-time constraints limit cadets to 3 honors or 1 AP per semester without approval by Dean of Students*

**Aerospace Program:** The four-semester curriculum leads selected Cadets to an FAA private pilot's license. Aerospace I is "ground school" preparation for the FAA written exam. Aerospace II is a hands-on flying course designed to prepare Cadets for the FAA "check ride."
