PROFILE 2024-2025

Marine Military Academy is accredited by both SAIS.

A private college-preparatory all-male boarding school, Marine Military Academy was founded in 1965 by Captain William A. Gary who believed that United States Marine Corps' concepts of leadership and discipline were adaptable to preparatory-school education. The Academy boards grades seventh through the post-graduate level. MMA boards students from all over the United States and over a dozen different countries — as close to home as Mexico and as far away as China. We balance discipline and structure with strong academic instruction to shape a purposeful, responsible young man who is prepared for the challenges of life.

Admission: The Academy seeks students of good character and serious purpose. A student is accepted on the basis of his transcript and recommendations from his school principal, counselor, English and Math teachers. A student's ability to participate fully in the physical activities program is required.

Student Leadership: The Cadet Corps is commanded by a *Cadet* Lieutenant Colonel and is organized into four companies. The companies are led by Cadet Officers and noncommissioned officers. Cadet leaders are carefully selected on the basis of their maturity and leadership abilities. All Cadets are members of the Marine Corps JROTC.

Graduation Requirements: The standard MMA diploma requires 26 academic credits for graduation and must include English 4½ credits; Mathematics 4 credits; Science 4 credits; Social Studies 4 credits; Foreign Language 2 credits; Computer Technology 1 credit; Health ½ credit; Speech ½ credit and electives 5.5 credits. Placement in Honors, Advanced Placement, and Dual Enrollment is by recommendation only. Due to study time constraints, it is recommended that Cadets take no more than 3 Honors or 3 AP/DE courses per semester.

Class rank is computed after the 6th, 7th and 8th semesters using a *cumulative total of grade points earned* (extra point awarded for Honors, Advanced Placement and Dual Enrollment). Only college-preparatory core courses are included.

Placement in Honors or Advanced Placement is by recommendation. Study-time constraints limit cadets to 3 honors or 3 AP/DE courses per year with approval by the Academic Dean.
